Tennessee State Daughters of the American Revolution Scholarships 2010 – 2011

Applicants must be U.S. citizens and Tennessee state residents.

Please use the following checklist for successful completion of the application process:

All required information must be submitted as one package. Each applicant must provide two copies of each application. Please, no photos with applications.

1. TSDAR Scholarship. A \$2500 scholarship (\$1250 in the fall semester, \$1250 in the spring semester) granted to a graduating senior who will be attending an accredited U.S. college/university granting a degree. This may be a nursing school or junior college, but not a vocational school. A 150 to 300 word essay is required, transcripts, resume, and two letters of recommendation from a minister, Scout leader, employer, or educator. Use the TSDAR Scholarship Application Information Sheet.

2. Ellen Davies Rodgers/Zachariah Davies Scholarship. A \$750 scholarship awarded to a full-time student entering his/her freshman year in an accredited U.S. college/university. This scholarship is not limited to a particular curriculum. A 300 to 500 word essay is required, transcripts, resume, a narrative on patriotic endeavors, and three letters of recommendation from a minister, CAR Senior Leader, Scout leader, employer, supervisor of community program, or educator (not more than one letter from each field). Use the Rodgers/Davies Scholarship application.

3. American History Scholarship. A \$1,000 scholarship granted to a graduating senior who will be attending an accredited U.S. college/university granting a degree, who will have a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History and American Government. The winner will be eligible to compete for the NSDAR Dr. Aura-Lee A. & James Hobbs Pittenger American History Scholarship of \$2,000 each year for up to four consecutive years. Use the NSDAR Scholarship Application and Financial Need Form.

Two scholarships are available for college bound Native Americans:

1. The American Indian Scholarship is for \$1,000, which requires a 2.75 grade point average (GPA) and has a deadline of Dec 15 to the Clinch Bend Chapter, NSDAR
2. The Frances Crawford Marvin American Indian Scholarship (one awarded per year) with a 3.0 GPA requirement and a variable award sum determined annually by the return on the endowment. Deadline of Dec 15 to the Clinch Bend Chapter, NSDAR

POLITICAL SCIENCE, HISTORY, GOVERNMENT AND ECONOMICS SCHOLARSHIPS
DR. AURA-LEE A. PITTENGER AND JAMES HOBBS PITTENGER AMERICAN HISTORY SCHOLARSHIP—A scholarship in the amount of \$2,000 each year for up to four consecutive years to a graduating high school senior who will have a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American history or American government while in college. United States citizens residing abroad may apply through a Units Overseas chapter. DEADLINE: February 15.

ENID HALL GRISWOLD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP—A one-time \$1,000 scholarship awarded to a deserving junior or senior enrolled in an accredited college or university in the United States who is majoring in political science, history, government or economics. DEADLINE: February 15.

NURSING SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

These are one-time awards of \$1,000. It is only necessary to submit one application for consideration for any award in this group or the Madeline Picket Halbert Cogswell Nursing Scholarship listed under special scholarships.

CAROLINE E. HOLT NURSING SCHOLARSHIP—A one-time \$1,000 scholarship for students who are in financial need and have been accepted or are enrolled in an accredited school of nursing. A letter of acceptance into the nursing program or the transcript stating that the applicant is enrolled in the nursing program must be included with the application. DEADLINE: February 15.

MEDICAL SCHOLARSHIPS

These awards are in the amount of up to \$5,000 annually for up to four years, with a maximum of \$20,000 total. These awards are available only in consecutive four year increments. It is necessary to submit only one application for consideration for any award in this group. All applicants must prove acceptance into an accredited school of medicine or if applicable a graduate level program for psychiatric nursing.

IRENE AND DAISY MACGREGOR SCHOLARSHIP—A \$5,000 scholarship awarded for up to four years to students of high scholastic standing and character who have been accepted into or are pursuing an approved course of study to become a medical doctor (no pre-med) at an approved, accredited medical school or in psychiatric nursing, graduate level, at medical schools, colleges or universities. There is a preference to females "if equally qualified." DEADLINE: April 15.

ALICE W. ROOKE SCHOLARSHIP—A \$5,000 scholarship awarded for up to four years to students who have been accepted into or who are pursuing an approved course of study to become a medical doctor (no pre-med) at approved, accredited medical schools, colleges and universities. DEADLINE: April 15.

SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

MARGARET HOWARD HAMILTON SCHOLARSHIP—A \$1,000 scholarship awarded for up to four years to a graduating high school senior who has been accepted into the Harvey and Bernice Jones Learning Center, housing the Ben D. Caudle Learning Program, University of the Ozarks, Clarksville, Arkansas. Applications must be requested directly from the learning center upon acceptance into their program for learning disabled students. DEADLINE: April 15.

LILLIAN AND ARTHUR DUNN SCHOLARSHIP—A \$2,000 scholarship awarded for up to four years to well qualified, deserving sons and daughters of members of the NSDAR for four years of college. Outstanding recipients will be considered for an additional period of up to four years of study. DAR member number of mother who is a current, dues-paying member, must be on the application. DEADLINE: February 15.

MADLINE PICKETT HALBERT COGSWELL NURSING SCHOLARSHIP—A one-time \$1,000 scholarship for students who have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing, who are members of NSDAR, descendants of members of NSDAR or are eligible to be members of NSDAR. A letter of acceptance into the nursing program or the transcript stating that the applicant is in the nursing program must be included with the application. DAR member number must be on the application. DEADLINE: February 15.

EDWARD G. AND HELEN A. BORGENS ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY TEACHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS—Two onetime, preferred amount awards of up to \$1,500 for students twenty-five (25) years of age or older. One award is given to students studying to teach at the elementary school level, the other to students studying to teach at the secondary level. All applicants must have at least a 3.50 GPA, be at least a college sophomore, and attend or plan on attending an accredited college or university. The award is based on academic merit and is not automatically renewable, though recipients may reapply for consideration as long as they meet the eligibility requirements. DEADLINE: April 15.
